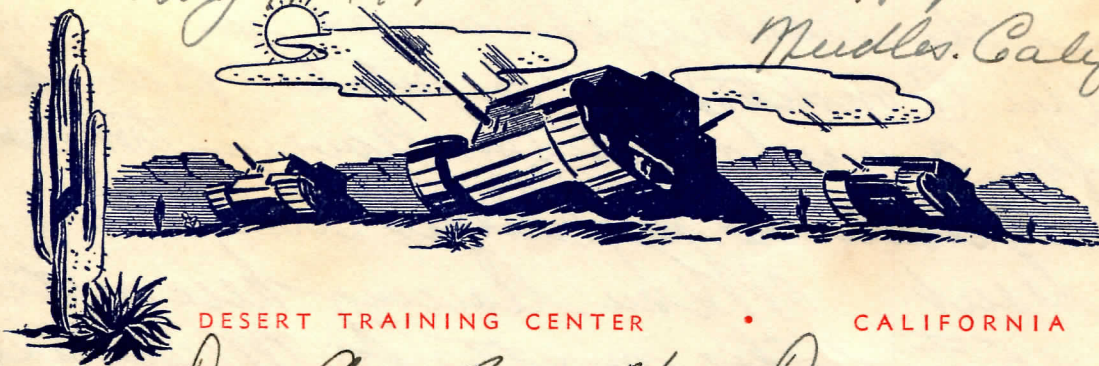

before they are called.

all O.K. as far as I know. Channing
just returned from the South
Pacific. He was there for 5 or 6 months
and believe me he saw plenty of
Action. Joe is somewhere in Texas
I believe. He is in the Air Corps. I'm
out here in a place that is next to
the fires of hell. I've been here
since April 17th. It's only 200
miles from the nearest town
where we can have liberty in.
The heat isn't so bad as it only gets
up to 120 to 140 in the heat of
the day. — I don't mind it

in the least right now as I'm in an
Air Conditioned Hospital. Been here
for 3 weeks but I'm leaving tomorrow
to return to my outfit out on the
desert. We are leaving here on the
15th of this month for Missouri
as our Manus are over out here.

I expect to get home on Durlough
some time next month as that is when
when I am expects to have Eddie ^{the 3rd}
some where around the 20th to the 26th. I am
hope that it is a log.

How's Bill, Eddie, and
Mrs. Ulmer. I've lost track of all
those folks being away for so long
a time.

How's Aunt Carrie, Aunt
Agnes and the rest of the folks in
Bermy. Give my regards to them
all.

Please excuse the writing
as my one finger is still Banded
up and pretty sore.
